

HOLES, HOLES, WHY ALL THE HOLES?

The Wilson television mount you have purchased has a universal wall or ceiling mounting plate. It is designed to offer maximum strength and holding power whether mounting to wood studs, concrete walls or ceilings, or concrete block walls.

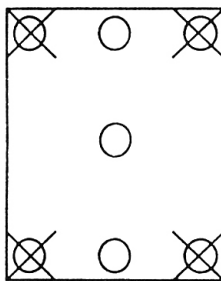


Figure 1. Hole pattern to be used for mounting onto wood joists. Use hole caps for holes marked with an "X".

Figure 1 indicates the recommended hole pattern to use for mounting into a wood joist structured wall. Three of the appropriate wood screws should be used and installed according to directions.

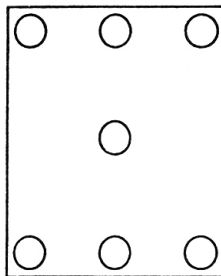

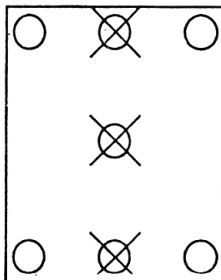


Figure 2. Hole pattern used for mounting onto concrete block. Use hole caps for holes marked with an "X".

As Figure 2 indicates, when anchoring into solid concrete or concrete block, a minimum of 4, and up to 7, anchoring points should be used. Again, the manufacturer's installment and assembly instructions must be followed.

Included with each mount are sufficient hole caps that can be used to "dress" the holes not used.

It is extremely important that all of the manufacturer's directions are followed, to the letter, to help insure that these mounts are correctly installed.

H. Wilson universal television mounting plate showing all available holes.
